Purpose of the Post

Together with Dr. Cong Ling (Imperial), Prof. Martin Albrecht received funding for "Bridging the Gap between Lattice-based Cryptography and Coding Theory" inspired by a joint seminar series co-organised by the two grant holders. The project aims to apply techniques from lattice-coding to cryptography to produce more efficient constructions and cryptanalytical attacks.

To carry research activity in the field of cryptography in collaboration with the research group. Specialised knowledge is required to proof theorems or find attacks.

Key Tasks

- Conducting research in cryptography in collaboration with Prof. Albrecht and the other team members;
- Writing papers for peer-reviewed venues, informal reports and presentations at scientific meetings;
- Attending conferences, workshops, and summer schools to disseminate the research;
- Assisting in arranging project meetings and workshops
- Using initiative and creativity to identify areas for research, developing new research ideas and extending the research portfolio
- Identify any practical and technical issues that require to be resolved and suggest solutions
- Undergo continued personal professional development
