#### Purpose of the Post

The post holder will work with data from the Twins Early Development Study (TEDS). The TEDS team have followed thousands of twin pairs since birth, tracking their emotional, cognitive and behavioural development. They will specifically work on the project exploring the developmental course of links between educational experiences and mental health longitudinally from childhood to adulthood. They will lead analyses and write up findings for publication, be involved in other projects and contribute to the identification of possible new areas of research. In addition, the post holder will attend relevant international meetings such as the Behavior Genetics Association and World Congress in Psychiatric Genetics to present the findings.

The lab is committed to Open and Reproducible Science. All our projects are preregistered in Open Science Framework and code is made publicly accessible.

# **Key Tasks**

- Conduct individual and collaborative research projects, duties to include: genetic and genomic analysis and interpretation of research data; writing up of research results.
- Serve as a first author on scientific publications arising from the project, under supervision of the Dr Kaili Rimfeld and other collaborators.
- Undertake statistical and data training as and if required for this role.
- Develop and initiate collaborative working internally and externally.
- Prepare and present findings of research activity to colleagues and at scientific meetings.
- Contribute to the preparation of grant applications, research presentations and publications as requested.
