Purpose of the Post

To undertake research for the AHRC-funded project, 'An Oral History of the Environmental Movement in the UK, 1970-2020', in collaboration with the research team. Responsible for planning, undertaking and interpreting life story interviews and short interviews, and for co-authoring relevant project outputs.

Key Tasks

- Carry out research in the form of c.20 life story interviews and shorter interviews in locations around the UK, using own initiative and creative judgement in developing strands of questioning and discussion and ensuring adequate backup of all project data
- Edit and annotate audio data in the required format, working with project team members and partners to meet required data standards
- Participate in witness seminars and assist in their organisation
- Compose research papers for peer-reviewed publication, in collaboration with CI and PI
- Prepare and present findings of research activity to colleagues and at workshops, conferences and seminars
- Take the initiative in overcoming methodological problems that arise during the project lifespan, and keep the CI and PI up to date with the project's progress
- Undergo continued personal professional development, including further research training where required

Other Duties
