Purpose of the Post

To teach and supervise film, television and immersive media producing and other related topics at postgraduate and other levels, taking full responsibility for the design, management, assessment and delivery of teaching. The role holder will be responsible for convening our well-established and highly-regarded MA Producing Film and Television course. They will also play a leading role in the ongoing development of the course, contributing to strengthening student recruitment and building relationships with external stakeholders. They will contribute to the academic administration of the department and will maintain and build relationships with the wider media production industry to support high quality teaching. They will show a strong commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion in education, professional practice and industry.

Key Tasks

Teaching

- To design, deliver, and assess high quality teaching programmes and/or courses, ensuring that our teaching meets the needs of a diverse student population.
- To undertake activities supporting teaching delivery in the field of film, television and immersive media production.
- To act as personal tutor as directed by the Head of Department, ensuring appropriate support and advice is provided.
- Provide strategic direction and continuous course development to maintain currency of teaching.
- To play a leading role in the expansion of curriculum options in this area working with others to ensure implementation as applicable.
- To contribute to other areas of teaching as directed by the Head of Department in response to departmental need.

Professional Practice

- Engage with external networks relevant to film, television and immersive media producing.
- Disseminate practice expertise through workshops or seminars or in other relevant forms.
- Engage in a range of activities relevant to the development of professional practice in film, television and immersive media producing.
- To develop and implement innovative strategies for industry informed teaching.

Leadership, Enhancement, External Engagement and Impact

- To lead a postgraduate programme in the relevant subject area.
- To play a full and active part in the administration of the department and its external promotion.
- To attend and actively contribute to departmental and School meetings and committees as appropriate.
- To contribute to the department's growing Film, Television and Immersive Producing opportunities and technologically innovative approach by organising events and student-facing opportunities.
- To play a leading role in developing strategies to maximise student recruitment.
- To participate with departmental or School working groups as required.
- To contribute to the department's strategic planning, and, if required, contribute to School and University strategic planning processes.
- To advise and provide support to less experienced colleagues.
- To co-ordinate and engage in departmental activities such as attendance at open days or applicant visitor days.
- To develop networks both internal and external to the University to develop research and teaching profile and funding opportunities individually and for the department, University and field of research i.e. educational bodies, specific research networks, professional bodies.
- To engage and maintain continuous professional development.

Other Duties

The duties listed are not exhaustive and may be varied from time to time as dictated by the changing needs of the University. The post holder will be expected to undertake other duties as appropriate and as requested by their manager.

The post holder may be required to work at any of the locations at which the business of Royal Holloway is conducted.

They will be responsible for the recruitment and management of visiting lecturers.

Liaising with relevant colleagues in the School of Performing and Digital Arts they will build closer links between MA Producing Film and Television and other postgraduate taught programmes in the School.
