Purpose of the Post

To contribute to the analysis of human-fire interactions and specifically explore the role of fire in mediating the relationship between cultural diversity and biodiversity.

Key Tasks

To lead research on examining the ecological impacts of different forms of human fire use such as cultural burning and livelihood fires, involving facilitating interdisciplinary, intersectoral and international collaborations.

To lead research on how knowledge of fire use practices is shared, adapted, and affected by other changes, including vegetation/land use changes, climate change and governance. The research may involve secondary data collation as well as empirical research through mixed methods including ethnography, participatory research, remote sensing, GIS and quantitative analysis of ecological and biodiversity datasets.

To work closely with a large number of academics, postdoctoral researchers and PhD students across the Centre's natural and social sciences in order to contribute to an interdisciplinary understanding of fire, livelihoods and biodiversity.

To facilitate Indigenous, local community and fire practitioner engagement with the Centre's mission.

To contribute to the dissemination of findings through conference presentations and journal articles, collaborating with others as necessary.

To contribute to the overall activities of the research team and the department as appropriate.

To carry out any other duties as are within the scope, spirit and purpose of the job as requested by the Associate Director.

Any other duties as required by the line manager or Head of Department that are commensurate with the grade.

Other Duties

The duties listed are not exhaustive and may be varied from time to time as dictated by the changing needs of the University. The post holder will be expected to undertake other duties as appropriate and as requested by their manager.
